### GSC General Meeting for 16th February 2022

# 1) Reports:

- a. President: Sergio Madrid
  - i. Student Fee Review Board Hearings: After a meeting that ran for almost 3 days, the Student Fee Review Board voted for a small increase in the Student Fee paid by all students. This was made keeping in mind that the ASNMSU system was trying to implement several changes, and the additional funds would help in paying for the changes as well as hire new student assistants who would facilitate the change.
  - ii. New GSC advisor: Mrs. Melody Munson-Mcgee, Special Assistant to the Vice President of Student Success, has joined the GSC as the new Staff Advisor.

## b. Vice President: Cynthia Wise

- i. University Administration Council
  - 1. Dr. Dorothy Campbell has been hired as the new Interim Provost after Dr. Renay Scoot indicated that she did not have the bandwidth to operate both as the VP of Student Success and the

Provost.

2. The Graduate School would continue to report directly to VP Scott until a new Provost and a new dean for the Graduate School had been hired.

- 3. VP of Student Success Dr. Renay Scott has also submitted a recommendation to Chancellor Arvizu to offer tuition renumeration to Graduate Student Employees starting Fall 2022. VP Scott also remarked that renumeration for health insurance might be harder to implement and she is still looking into that
- 4. Dr. Carol Flinchbaugh, Interim dean of the Graduate School, provided an update on the Healthcare survey run by the Graduate School.
- 5. Dr. Flinchbaugh also encourages students to apply for Scholarships on Scholar Dollar as there are several scholarships on offer.
- ii. Graduate Council

1. Changes will be implemented in the structure of the Council owing to the change in the structure of NMSU administration

- 2. GSC Vice President Wise apprised the attendees about the events that GSC is planning later in the semester
- 3. Vice President Wise also discussed the need to review which GSO's dissolved due to the pandemic
- iii. Faculty Senate: The following items were discussed.
  - Lengthen the time students must add classes without instructor permission
  - 2. Discussion of a proposal to reduce the number of credits required for full-time status for graduate students from 9-to-6.

  - ii. Audrey Dijeau on behalf of the AAPI Initiative:
    - 1. The students currently serving as active members on the initiative had met once with Dr. Scholz, the Vice President of Equity, Inclusion and Diversity, on February 3<sup>rd</sup> and she has agreed to invite the active members to a meeting with the Diversity Directors.
    - 2. The Interim Director of Chicano Programs will make sure that the speakers who are coming in April address anti-Asian xenophobia.
    - 3. Black Programs has extended an offer to use their space if the AAPI students feel the need for a

safe space to be in.
