 - i. Funding from the Graduate School
 - 1. Dean Lacey presented– the <u>Graduate School</u> has a <u>Conference Travel Award</u> program to help graduate students present their work (papers, posters, exhibits and performances) at regional, national and international conferences and professional meetings. Students are required to obtain some money from their department and/or college in order to receive a travel award. They accept applications from September 1st to April 1st. ii. College of Arts and Sciences

1. Dean Brown presented– The College of Arts and Sciences has set aside money for graduate students: Graduate Student Travel Grants.
